Water Depth: 42m

Scope of Work: The transportation and Installation of the 3000T Sumandak-B Jacket by launch and upend method.

The launch barge was CBL-102 and the installation is being done with Dalihao.

The scope of work for the Dalihao involves driving piles thru 6 legs, installation of 18 conductors and making the jacket ready for deck installation later by TLO.
